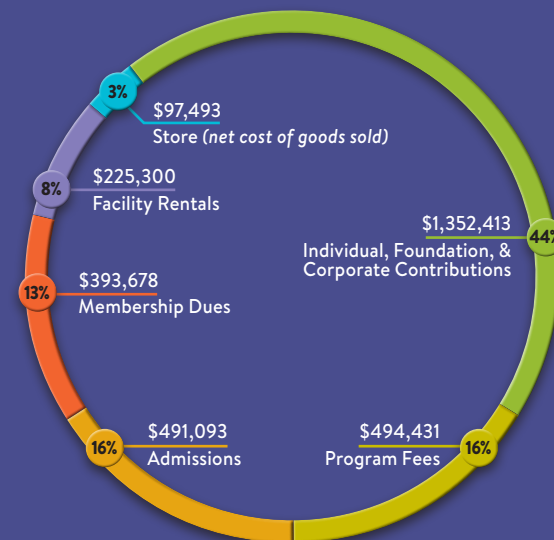

FISCAL YEAR OCTOBER 1, 2016 TO SEPTEMBER 30, 2017

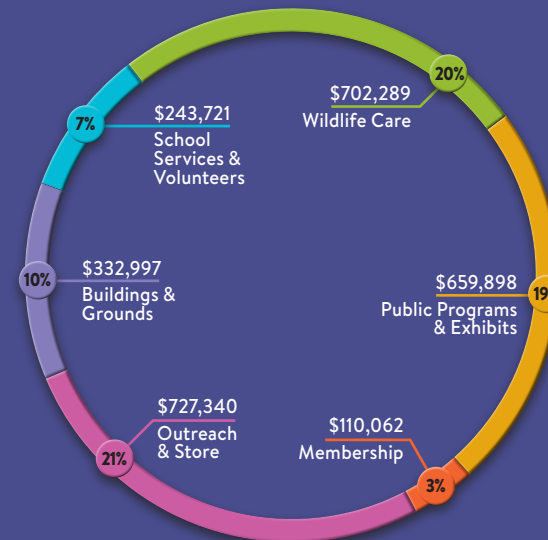
FY 2017 REVENUE

In total we spent \$3,463,330 of which \$2,776,307 (80%) was for Program and Membership Expenses and \$687,023 (20%) was for Administrative and Fundraising Expenses.

CuriOdyssey saw an increase in earned revenue as compared to the prior fiscal year. The expense numbers represented here do not include non-cash adjustments such as depreciation and rent expense. There was an overall operating loss in FY17 due in part to the date of the annual fundraiser moving into FY18.

DONOR PROFILE

The Bay Area lost a great friend when **Bill Bowes** passed away in late 2016. Through the William K. Bowes, Jr. Foundation, CuriOdyssey received \$1 Million for *The Campaign for CuriOdyssey*. During Bill's last visit to CuriOdyssey, while observing all the children engaged in the science exhibits, he remarked, "this is something really important."



Bill was a champion of science throughout the Bay Area, contributing to programs in education, basic science, stem cell research and medicine.
