# THE YEAR IN REVIEW



In 2015, CuriOdyssey celebrated an exciting announcement with the public launch of a capital campaign to build the Bay Area's premier serious science playground. We also saw the highest attendance in our history, exceeding the previous year's numbers by 14%. We experienced a 31% increase in event rentals, 16% increase in store net revenue, 12% increase in admissions revenue, 11% increase in program fees, 7% increase in membership and summer camps were 97% full.

## BIG ANNOUNCEMENT

This year we celebrated an exciting milestone with the public launch of CuriOdyssey's capital campaign to build the San Francisco Bay Area's premier serious science playground. We broke the news with an evening VIP launch event, followed by a public celebration and kick-off with our community. Executive Director Rachel Meyer, along with Congresswoman Jackie Speier, State Senator Jerry Hill, Supervisor Carole Groom, and San Mateo Mayor Maureen Freschet each spoke in support of the capital campaign for a new building, and together they unveiled a rendering of the new CuriOdyssey.

## RECORD-BREAKING ATTENDANCE

During this year 170,885 people were impacted by CuriOdyssey between October 1, 2014 and September 30, 2015. This figure represents a 14% increase over the previous fiscal year and makes it the highest attendance in the organization's recent history. The year-over-year increase in attendance can be attributed largely to our continued focus on informal, inquiry-based science education for children in public programs, workshops and camps. This approach has resonated with the Bay Area community. By giving children the tools scientists use and encouraging them to let the natural world answer their questions, CuriOdyssey has won the support of educators, parents, and kids who return each year for in-depth learning experiences.

## NEW ANIMALS

This year we welcomed new additions to our animal family. Two young male raccoons joined the two female raccoons on exhibit for public view, and three new female barn owls were placed on exhibit in the Raptor Aviary. All of these animals play a role in educating school children, groups, and visitors in the importance of conservation and animal care.

## RECOGNITION

Upon the public launch of our capital campaign, we were issued Certificates of Recognition by both Jackie Speier of the United States House of Representatives and Jerry Hill of the California State Senate, in support of our efforts to build the Bay Area's premier serious science playground.

Our Maker Faire exhibit was given an Editor's Choice and a Best in Class award. For the seventh consecutive year, we were recognized by Bay Area Parent Magazine as a Family Favorite museum.

## EDUCATIONAL OUTREACH

CuriOdyssey continued its leadership in the science education field. We renewed our partnership with Fiesta Gardens International School to provide science experiences for children in the underserved community. Through the program, we provide informal, inquiry-based science education to each of the kindergarten through fifth grade classrooms, free of charge, multiple times a year. We also continued our partnership with the Big Brothers Big Sisters of the Bay Area to provide free admission for program participants, and deepened our relationship with the Mid-Peninsula Boys and Girls Club with expanded after school science programming.

## CONSERVATION

This year saw the extension of partnerships with numerous local wildlife conservation organizations. We continued our leadership of the Bay Area Chapter of FrogWatch USA that monitors frog and toad activity. We also continued important collaborations with the River Otter Ecology Project, Ringtail Research Project, and the Bay Area Bobcat Project in order to study and conserve local wildlife populations. Additionally, we began a new partnership with the Urban Wildlife Project which monitors gray foxes in the Baylands Nature Preserve in Palo Alto.

## NEW EXHIBITION

We opened *Reflections & Perceptions*, a brand new, eleven piece sensory exhibition that enables exploration of visual and tactile perception. This exhibition allows visitors to experience surprising optical effects by experimenting with various materials. We also installed a first-of-its-kind public art piece, Pinwheels, on the exterior of our building, facing the Bay. The large-scale installation makes the invisible visible by highlighting the movement and patterns of wind on the Bay. Finally, we relocated our Northern Pacific Tree Frog Pond exhibit within the gardens in order to improve the overall viability of the pond as a breeding pool.

We give children the tools to think like scientists as an imperative for ensuring that our next generation can innovate solutions for the pressing environmental challenges of our times. I am proud to thank the many generous donors listed here who have joined our cause and who have given their leadership support to The Campaign for CuriOdyssey.

As our adventure continues in 2016, I invite all of you along for the ride.

## DONOR PROFILE: THE TAYLOR FAMILY

CuriOdyssey owes much to the Taylor family, who have been involved since the earliest days of our 60-year history. Polly Taylor has been a volunteer since 1959, and continues her service to the present day. Her daughter, Kat Taylor, Co-Chairs the Campaign for CuriOdyssey and, with husband Tom Steyer, runs the TomKat Charitable Trust, the generous donor of our \$2 million matching challenge grant, which is in addition to a \$5 million initial campaign gift.

*We asked Polly Taylor to tell us about the history of her connection to CuriOdyssey.*

**How did you first get involved with CuriOdyssey?** “In 1959 when I was a provisional with the Junior League of San Francisco I was asked to do some volunteer work with a local charity group that was closer to home. I chose the San Mateo County Junior Museum which was the beginning of our present CuriOdyssey. I had two small children and it appealed to me with its location and animals. I spent every Wednesday afternoon there staffing the desk and taking care of the small animals we housed in the old quonset hut which was our first home at Coyote Point.”

**What is your favorite memory of CuriOdyssey?** “My favorite memory is when we were able to move the organization from our small home to what at the time seemed a grand, larger building on the hill, [CuriOdyssey’s current facility] thanks to large donations from benefactors in the community.”

**What does your family’s involvement with CuriOdyssey mean to you?** “My daughter, who was only one year old when I started to work at Coyote Point, is now the chief benefactor and fundraiser for CuriOdyssey with a family of her own, and all because I brought her here at the tender age of one. She and her family have taken over as champions of the cause.”

**Why do you support CuriOdyssey?** “We support CuriOdyssey because there are few places in the Bay Area (if not California!) that fuse a scientific quest for answers with an imaginative spirit of discovery.”

“Kids are treated as intelligent learners; nothing is ‘dumbed down’ even for the youngest.”

**What is the one thing you would tell someone who was considering supporting our cause?** “Learning to tinker — to question the status quo, to rethink your perspective, to fail and try again — is critical to the success of every child. School gives kids knowledge, the hands on experience at CuriOdyssey gives them understanding.”

“My husband, parents and I view giving as an investment in our community and this is one investment that has an astronomical rate of return - empowering the lives of more than 100,000 children every year!”

**What are your hopes for the future of this organization?** “CuriOdyssey should be internationally recognized for its innovative approach to teaching. I envision museum directors and educators from other parts of the world traveling to CuriOdyssey to learn how to engage kids in ways that create a lifelong interest in science and the environment. Over time, CuriOdyssey should track how many kids from their camps go on to science-related professions — I have no doubt it will be a significant number.”

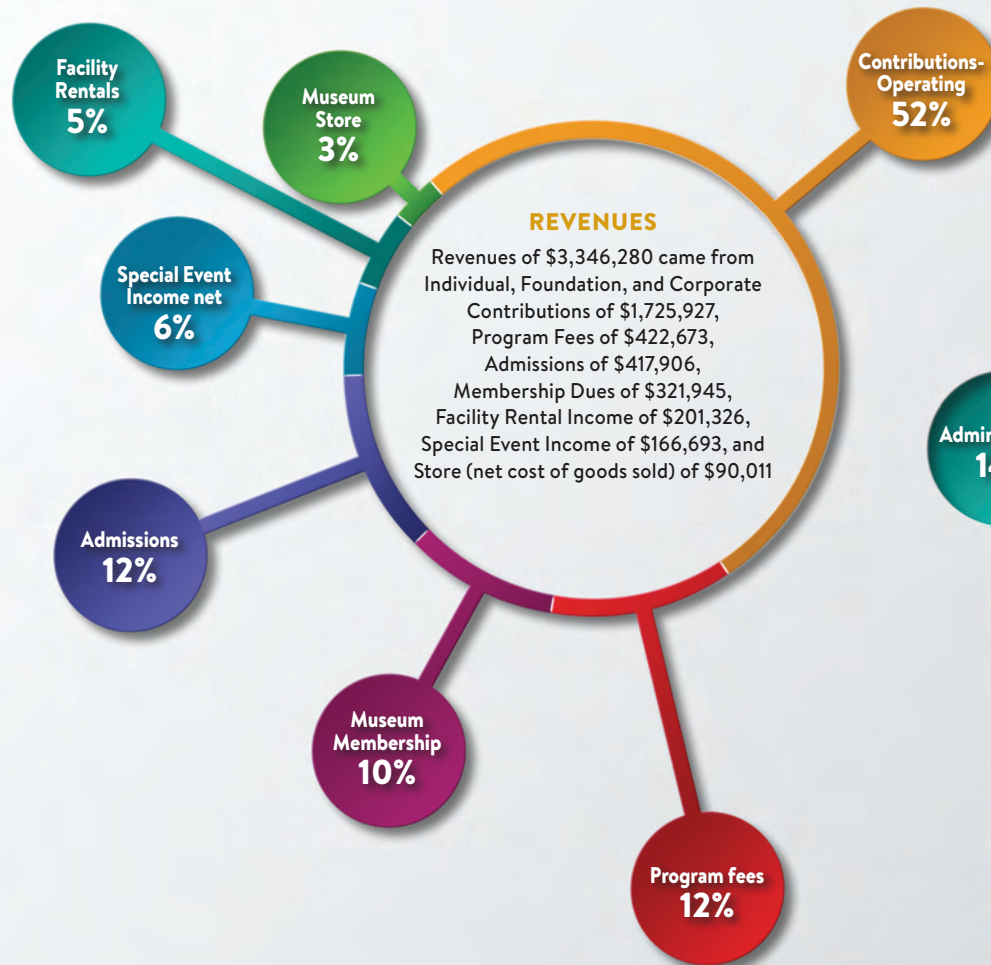




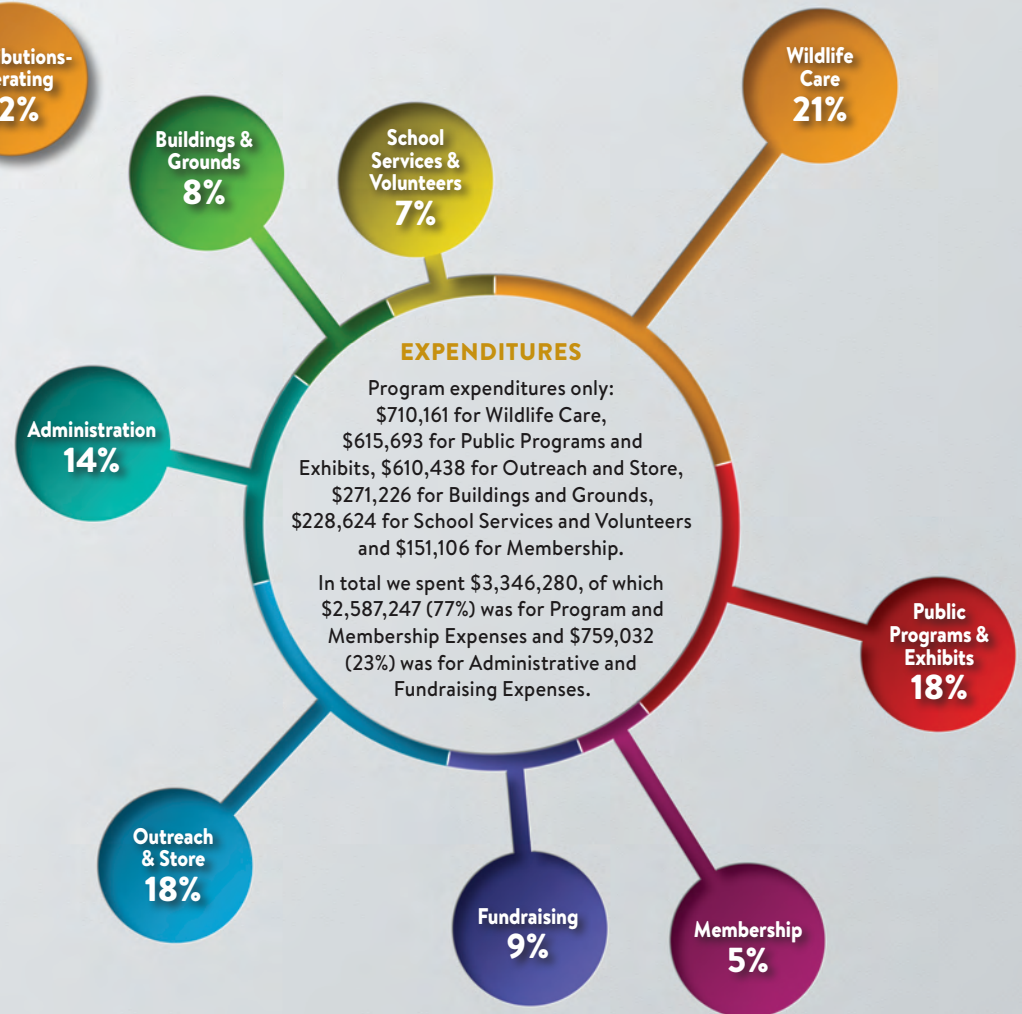
# FINANCIAL REVIEW 2014-2015
